## MAIN TAKE-AWAYS...

- New co-creation approach with all R&I stakeholders working jointly on actions and initiatives is an engine for the new ERA
- Several ERA actions are delivering observable (baseline) results, others indicate low or slow progress, 2010-2020
- Varied implementation of ERA priorities across Member States limits overall progress
- Greatest variances observed in knowledge valorisation, challenge-based actions, and education synergies
- EU-level initiatives to address gaps and harmonise ERA implementation are vital, as too closer monitoring effort
- Further insights on trends, barriers and enablers at national level anticipated in ERA Monitoring country reports
- The ERA Monitoring Mechanism is key to mapping progress and crafting effective R&I policies and practices (EU and MS)
- The 'EU-level Report' serves as a baseline for future evidence-informed R&I policymaking across Europe
